During the third Saturday of November, the city of Teruel, relives 1912 as it happened in Teruel. A boom era in which modernist art buildings predominated.



The daily life in the early twentieth century is reenacted in the city. A time when an intellectual elite provoked technology and mindset changes in society that placed it in Modernism. Bringing water, the arrival of the railway, the electric light and many other things made this a "golden age" which brought a special shine before the arrival of the Great War.

A significant number of activities converge during this weekend. Visitors will find guided tours, characters, theatre props, music and dances enacting the bourgeois and rural world that coexisted in Teruel city around 1912. Two will be the spaces that host the celebration:

- Plaza de San Juan, where Marín Theater and the Casino are located, two emblematic places at the time, where bourgeoisie and traders gathered as well as the common people did in the outside. We will enjoy several exhibitions and live performances in these big spaces.



- Plaza del Torico, former Market Square. Some of the most outstanding modernist buildings in the city can be found here. Both "Casa del Torico" and "La Madrileña" make up the ideal setting to house the atmospheres of the Bourgeois Festivity and the one that could be found a morning in the Market Square where the different guilds would meet: barbers, knife-grinders, bakers or basket makers
